




PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Palm Sunday and Holy Week Celebrations





Following Palm Sunday, we will enter the Sacred Triduum. Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil/Easter Sunday. This three-day celebration (Triduum) tells the whole story of our celebration. I invite you to come and celebrate with us this most beautiful mystery of our faith.

Holy Week Highlights

Holy Thursday

We celebrate three things:

- 1. The institution of the Holy Eucharist
- 2. The institution of the Holy Priesthood
- 3. Jesus giving us the great commandment of love. This he shows by the washing of feet.

On this day, after Mass, we keep watch with Jesus. Will you not keep watch with me for an hour?

Good Friday

We celebrate the Passion of our Lord. The worst day of His life was the day when He loved the most.

Holy Saturday

The culmination of the drama of Holy Week.

If you haven't attended this before, come and experience it this year: the fire of Easter, the renewal of baptismal promises, the exsultet. It is the most beautiful celebration of our faith life.

I invite you to come and experience God's love in these celebrations. Let us show Jesus that we love Him.

On Monday, following Palm Sunday, the whole of our diocese (Laity and priests) will gather at the Cathedral in Nelson to celebrate the Chrism Mass. The oils we use for Baptism, Confirmation and Anointing of the Sick will be blessed during the celebration. On Wednesday during Mass, we will solemnly present these oils to our community. The Mass will be a healing Mass where the sick will be anointed with the fresh oil - the oil of the sick.

May we all enter in and make the Palm Sunday and Holy Week of 2023 the best ever.

Pastor's Message Continued...

My take on Holy Week.

For me, I believe that what is on display this Holy Week and at Easter is God's love for each human being on the face of the earth.

Our participation in Holy Week celebrations is our way of saying to Jesus: 'I love you my Jesus, my Saviour, my friend. I'll follow you this Holy Week until Easter and all the days of my life.' May the Lord receive the offering of our life that we make to Him this week.

I was reading from Archbishop Chaput's book titled: 'Things Worth Dying For: Thoughts on a Life Worth Living' "I do not have to win the world, even for Christ: I have to save my soul. That is what I must always remember....it is not our mission to make truth triumph but to testify to it."

Another line from the book is very comforting to me: "In the mind of Jesus, we - despite ourselves, despite our failures, despite the confused creatures we so often are - are worth dying for we can at least try to live and die for others."

As you come for Holy Week celebrations or as you participate from home, may you always remember and even say to yourself: I AM WORTH DYING FOR!




