PASTOR'S MESSAGE

This mysterious covering of statues..... Why? Why cover that which is beautiful?

As a child I was always intrigued to see statues covered in our parish shortly before Holy Week. Maybe you often wonder whv.

I remember a few years ago some grade 7 students asked me why we had to cover the statues. One said, "I love to see the face of our Lady of Lourdes whenever I come to Church." That touched my heart deeply. It became a moment for us to learn together.

Let's see why it's covered:

It's usually covered in Canada the week before Palm Sunday, that is, before Holy Week.

- It heightens our senses and builds a longing within us for
- 2. Alerts us to the special time we are in and to get ready for the most sacred week of our faith life.
- Focus our senses on the striking words we hear during the Passion narrative and to enter into the scene and become part of the drama.

The veils are not meant to be there forever. They will be removed before Easter Vigil. This is a reminder of our own lives. We live in a veiled world; we are in exile here from our true home land - heaven. It is only through our own death that the veil of our life is lifted, and we are finally able to see the beauty of everything in our lives.

"Well, that's what I learned. Hope that helps," I said to her. She smiled and nodded her head. But she couldn't wait for Easter: to see, once again, the face of our Lady. You should have seen the joy on her face as she came to Mass on Easter Sunday and beheld the face of our Lady.

With that in mind, next week, we will enter into the most sacred week experiencing the love of Jesus for us. As his life and ours meet in the week's celebrations, we pray: Jesus, thank You for all you did for me. I want to show You this week and always that I love you. Make my life beautiful.

I would like to express my gratitude to all who contributed in one way or another to make the parish events of the past week meaningful and a grace-filled.
